Board News: In April, the election brought us 2 new Trustees to the Board; 1st is Brett Stump who is the owner/operator of Indian Point Marina. 2nd is Jim McGregor who has past experience as a business owner/operator in the hotel/restaurant business. After swearing in the new Trustees they elected their officials as Chairman—Ryan McGinness, Vice-Chair– Barb Rose and Secretary/Treasurer—Linda Slaughter, They then went on to appoint the members of the Police & Emergency Committee. They discussed the Village mowing for the summer and awarded the bid to Premier Lawn Services for \$1,150.00 per cut to include the Village office. Throughout April and May the Trustees bid, negotiated and awarded the contract to apply 1/4” micro-surfacing to Indian Point Road from top to bottom. Some of the work has already commenced, so please be aware of workers for the next couple of weeks. Also, in May, a new computer was purchased for the Village office, all the working files have been transferred and the old computer backed up though it is still available to pull information from.

Police & Emergency: The P&E Committee and the Trustees have been wading through the applications received for the Police Chief position. We did receive a lot of responses to our request, they have now arrived at the Interviewing stage of the process and hopefully will have a candidate chosen soon. There are now 2 Reserve officers patrolling the Point along with Allen Hamlin, our full-time officer. The new officers are Kenneth Burgman and Joseph Chalifoux, be sure to offer a warm greeting should you encounter either. Since we’ve entered our season for heavy tourism, please be more conscious of pedestrians along IP Road. And also, keep in mind this is the time for mischief to occur, so please be on heightened aware of your surrounding properties and people around. With the 4th of July holiday coming up, please remember the appropriate times for fireworks as set forth in the IP Ordinance: Fireworks are allowed from June 25th through July 5th during the hours of 10 AM thru 10 PM; except on the 4th...the time is extended to Midnight. We appreciate your observance of this and please have a safe Holiday!

The Commission has been trying to meet monthly for review and revisions to the most recent version of the "Master Plan". They have also been addressing the issue of the rezoning of Lots 14 & 15 of Block A in Table Rock Landing. The request was made by the new owners of the Antler's Resort to have room for expansion of the resort. In April, they recommended with approval a re-plat of Indian Trails Resort for the new owners at that location. Then in May approved an extension of the Preliminary Plat at Bayside for Stillwaters Resort.

Jakes Creek Trail Sewer System

After an engineering study on the last five years of gathered data, on June 9th, 2015 the Trustees passed a new rate Ordinance for the Sewer Users. The new rate structure designed an increase of 3% for Residential users, 5% for Commercial Users and the Crowne View Development and individual owners will now be billed on a whole by their metered water usage.
