April will be the last month for Saturday Recycling, unless more people come forward to volunteer on Saturday's. It appears that Thursday is the day of choice for the majority of recyclers on Indian Point and volunteers will continue to be present on Thursday.

Please note: As stated above, hours to recycle change in May. We are all volunteers, and in the Ozarks, heat can be an issue. There is little or no shade and the center becomes too hot by midday.

Please don't forget to save your aluminum cans and take them to one of the collection areas on Indian Point: The Cottage, Deer Run Campground, White Wing Resort & Treehouse Condos. Reeds Spring Recycling pays us the current rate on the aluminum and the monies will be used to help landscape the Village Office at the entrance to Indian Point.

Nestle Purina collected and replaced the paper bin on February 22nd. The bin contained 3.34 tons of paper products. This was a sizeable load in comparison to collections in 2006, at which time we had a total of 7.75 tons for three collections. Good job recyclers! Thanks to all who bring in old phone books, magazines, catalogs, junk mail, newspapers and shredded paper. Nestle Purina is thankful to receive these products to make cat and dog litter. Truly recycling.

Other items collected at Indian Point Recycle Center:

- **Metal food cans** with labels removed and flatten.
- **Number 1 & 2 threaded plastics.** There are many other plastic items containing the numbers 1 or 2 that we are unable to collect at this time. The explanation given to us is plastic melts down at different temperatures. Perhaps we will be able to collect other plastics in the future, since we live in a world of constant change.
- **Glass** collection has started on a trial basis. Please separate by color. Ron Player has volunteered to take glass to the Branson Recycle Center for us and much will depend on volume and how often he needs to provide this service.
